They went to Spain looking for a better life, stayed there for eleven years, and never thought that the entire family would come to live in United States of America; however, like many Cubans, after a few years, the family decided to resettle in the USA. Upon their arrival to this country, they spent the first two months living in a motorhome in a very isolated area of Hialeah.

Ms. Fernandez applied for her work permit, but a mistake delayed the process so she had to resubmit her work permit application and continued to survive the best she could without a job.
