Ms. Ledo's childcare center opened its doors on July 12, 2013. She currently has a total of 4 children enrolled. Ms. Ledo is very grateful to the SAVES program and The Refugee Child Care Micro-enterprise Developmental Project for the support and opportunities provided to her.
