She received benefit of having the professional degrees translated and certified without generating any cost to her. The only requirements asked of her were to maintain excellent attendance and academic progress, which she has more than fulfilled. Ms. Cabrera has surpassed all expectations. She is delighted to belong to a program that requires perseverance and consistency giving her the power to advance in her education and join American society.

Currently, she is working in data entry at the Trans Express Company where she uses the every day work skills acquired at The English Center School. She states that once she finishes with her last accounting class, she will continue furthering her language skills at The English Center School with the great aid of S.A.V.E.S. She wishes to continue being part of this wonderful program until she becomes a citizen of this country. Ms. Cabrera is proof of the ongoing effort that immigrants demonstrate every day and how SAVES is there to lay a helping hand every step of the way.
