He returned but after an unfortunate incident he was forced to have himself deported as he found himself homeless with no family in a foreign country. This time he spent approximately 15 days in Haiti and got another opportunity to move back to Mexico. His family feared for his wellbeing and asked that he not leave but he went back to Mexico again. He knew he had to take a chance in his search for better opportunities. This time, after a few months in Mexico, he was able to hire an attorney to help him with the Mexican immigration process, eventually leading to him moving to the United States and applying for parole.
